Key Facts Artists/sculptures/styles

'Art' does not always look the same.

'Art' can be made from different materials, shapes, sizes, forms, techniques etc.

A person who creates artwork is called an artist.

Artwork can be created independently or collaboratively. I can draw from my imagination (something that I have made up or changed).

I can draw from observation (recreating a picture of something that is in front of me).

Keith Haring

Keith Haring was born on May 4, 1958 in Reading, Pennsylvania. He had three sisters. Haring developed a love for drawing at an early age, learning basic cartooning skills from his father, who drew comics as a hobby.

As a child, Haring enjoyed the popular animation of Disney, Dr. Seuss, and Looney Toons.

After High School, in 1976, Haring studied Commercial A in the Ivy School of Professional Art in Pittsburah.

In 1978 he moved to New York's Lower East Side and enrolled in The School of Visual Arts (SVA). He soon discovered an art scene happening in the streets and subways led by street and Graffiti artists.

Throughout the 1980s, Haring produced dozens of mura and public works all over the world, including in Europe, South America, and Australia.

Haring continued to make huge quantities of artwork righ up until his death. Sadly Haring died on February 6th 1990 of an illness. He was only 31 years old.

Key Learning:


- Use variety of tools, including: pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt-tips, charcoal, chalk and other dry media
- Use a sketchbook to gather and collect artwork.
- Begin to explore the use of line, shape and colour.
- Create a series of self-portraits using mixed media (pencil sketch, pastels, coloured pencil, paint)
 - Observational drawing
 - Colour mixing
 - Use of line, shape, colour
