










		Year 1 Subject - History Topic: Superheroes Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Florence Nightingale is remembered for changing the way hospitals were run during the Crimean War.</li><li>Florence Nightingale is known as the 'Lady with the Lamp'</li><li>In 1860 Florence Nightingale set up her own nursing school to teach others how to become a nurse!</li><li>Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica to a Scottish soldier and her mother was a Jamaican nurse and helper</li><li>In 1866 Mary Seacole set off to Crimea on a ship stocked with medical supplies and opened a 'British Hotel'</li><li>Mary Seacole wanted to help the soldiers so she used her own money to travel to help</li><li>Mary Seacole lived an exciting life, she travelled to many different countries helping people.</li></ul>	<div><div><div>Queen Victoria born 24th May 1819</div><div>Crimean War 5th October 1853– 30th March 1856</div><div>Queen Victoria dies 22nd January 1901</div></div><div><div>Mary Seacole born 23rd November 1805</div><div>Florence Nightingale born 12th May 1820</div><div>Mary Seacole dies 14th May 1881</div><div>Florence Nightingale dies 13th August 1910</div></div></div> <div><div></div><div><div><div>Mary Seacole Florence Nightingale</div></div></div><div></div></div>

Crimean War	The war where Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole served as nurses
community	A group of people living in the same place
disease	A condition that causes harm to the health of a person, animal or plant
doctors	Doctors <b>treat and care for those who are sick and injured</b> . A doctor will diagnose patients and give them medicine to treat them and make them better.
health	Keeping your body working at its best
hygiene	Activities which help to maintain good health especially through cleanliness
hospital	Somewhere you go to get medical treatment and nursing care if you are sick or injured.
injured	Harmed or damaged
infection	An illness caused by spreading germs
Monarch	A person who reigns over an empire
nurse	Nurses <b>give medicine, change bandages, help patients move around, and provide other treatment</b> . They give advice on how to get well and how to stay healthy
