Key word	Definition	
Focus	is the centre of interest or activity in a work of art.	
Photo Filter	is a pre-made template for adjusting the contrast, colour balance, and other aesthetic settings of a digital photo	
Saturate	makes colours more vivid (less black or white added).	
Desaturate	makes colours more muted (more black or white added)	
Colourise	to add colour to (a black-and-white film) by means of a computer.	
Layer	are an essential digital feature of image editing software. They are like <b>stacked sheets of transparent paper</b> . Using layers to overlap each other gives depth to an illustration.	
Tessellation	the process or art of <u>tessellating</u> a surface, or the state of being <u>tessellated</u> .	
Profile	a representation of something in outline. especially: a human head or face represented or seen in a side view.: an outline seen or represented in sharp relief: contour.	
Silhouette	the dark shape and outline of someone or something visible in restricted light against a <u>brighter</u> background.
