Unit 4.4: Easter

Why did Judas betray Jesus? What does it mean to betray someone?	Looking at artwork depicting the events in the Easter story.
How does it feel to be betrayed? What is forgiveness?	Ask pupils to describe/explain what they could learn from the behaviour of Peter, Judas and the women.
