To create mood and emotion within figures


Paint a Victorian street setting using tone and texture

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Key word	Definition
Artist	painter of sculptor
Technique	Method to achieve the desired effect, e.g. colour wash
Texture	what the surface feels like
Tone	light or dark
Pressure	Force on the surface, to create light or dark
Horizontal/Vertical/Diagonal	Direction of lines
Shading	Different colours, soft and light or heavy and dark
Figures	people, animals, shapes
