






<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sculpture is three-dimensional (3D) art Sculptors use four basic processes - carving, modelling, casting, constructing They can be made from stone, wood, Modroc, clay or any other material the artist wants to use. Florists wire. A sculpture may look exactly like a person or object (figurative) or may reflect shapes and forms that the artist invents (abstract) Sculpture can be free-standing or mounted, for example, on a plinth. Key word	Definition
3D OR THREE-DIMENSIONAL	things that look (or are) solid. For example, a cube is a 3-D shape
DESIGN	the organization of line, form, colour, value, texture and space in an eye-pleasing arrangement
DETAILS	dealing with some item by showing all of the particulars
ILLUSTRATION	work of art created to accompany a story or other literary work in print
LANDSCAPE	the scenery of an inland area, a painting or drawing of the land or natural environment
MEDIUM	the material used to make a work of art eg: wire
THEME	the main idea underlying the subject in a work of art eg: rainforest
