<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The physical geography of a country determines whether foods can or cannot be grown there i.e. climate/ vegetation• The UK is in the Northern Hemisphere• Breakfast foods (wheat, rice and Maize) are grown in the USA, India, China, Vietnam and Brazil• Temperate climate zones are warm in summer, cool in winter and have a moderate rainfall• Mediterranean climate zones are warm throughout the year• Fair trade is a way of buying and selling products that allows the farmers to be paid a fair price for their produce, and have better working conditions.
