### **Key Facts**

- The physical geography of a country determines whether foods can or cannot be grown there i.e. climate/vegetation
- The UK is in the Northern Hemisphere
- Breakfast foods (wheat, rice and Maize) are grown in the USA, India, China, Vietnam and Brazil
- Temperate climate zones are warm in summer, cool in winter and have a moderate rainfall
- Mediterranean climate zones are warm throughout the year
- Fair trade is a way of buying and selling products that allows the farmers to be paid a fair price for their produce, and have better working conditions.


### **Key Learning:**


- To understand that the food we eat comes from many different places around the world.
