<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Anglo Saxons were made up of three tribes; the Angles, Saxons and Jutes</li> <li>They came to Britain from Scandinavia in the middle of the 5th Century</li> <li>For a long time, England was not one country, Anglo-Saxon kings ruled lots of small kingdoms across the land</li> <li>The Anglo-Saxons were fierce people who fought many battles, including fighting each other.</li> <li>The Anglo Saxons used an alphabet called 'runes'</li> <li>The Anglo-Saxon period ended when the Normans conquered Britain in 1066</li> </ul>	<div data-bbox="1288 339 1794 584"> </div> <div data-bbox="1034 601 2063 876"> <p><b>Timeline</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>AD 396 - 398:</b> Picts, Scots and Saxons constantly raid Roman Britain.</li> <li><b>AD 410:</b> Romans leave Britain to defend Rome which was under attack. Angles, Saxons and Jutes make their way from Germany and South Denmark.</li> <li><b>AD 450:</b> The Anglo-Saxons began to settle alongside the Britons.</li> <li><b>AD 500:</b> By AD 500, the seven kingdoms had been created.</li> <li><b>AD 597:</b> St Augustine helps missionaries spread the word about Christianity. King Ethelbert converts to Christianity.</li> <li><b>AD 731:</b> Bede completes the Ecclesiastical History of English Peoples.</li> <li><b>AD 789:</b> The Vikings begin to raid Britain.</li> </ul> </div>
