


<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The Victorians were the people who lived during the reign of <u>Queen Victoria</u>, from the 20 June 1837 until 22 January 1901.</li><li>• During the Victorian era, Britain expanded its territory throughout the world and became the largest, richest and most powerful empire in world history.</li><li>• New inventions like the telephone, motorcar, typewriter and moving film totally changed the way people lived, worked and travelled.</li><li>• Expansion of the railways meant that people could travel faster and further than ever before.</li><li>• Booming industry meant that people moved to cities to find work.</li><li>• Better technology meant lots of people were without jobs.
