<p>Children name the countries within the Central Powers alliance: Germany, Austria – Hungary & Italy.</p> <p>Children name the countries within the Triple Entente: France, Britain & Russia</p> <p>The assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand was the catalyst that began the most horrible war in Europe until this point</p> <p>Inventions within warfare inventions that were used and developed during the war including machine guns, aircraft (zeppelins and planes), tanks, dreadnoughts and U boats.</p> <p>Several conventions were held between countries that outlined the rules of warfare and the rights of neutral countries. 1907 and called the Hague Convention.</p> <p>Animals such as pigeons, horses, camels, dogs and cats were used in the war.</p> <p>120,000 men signed up to the army</p> <p>Recruitment methods - conscription of men aged 18 to 41 in 1916.</p>
