Continent	Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land.
Equator	A line notionally drawn on earth equidistant from the poles dividing earth into northern and southern hemisphere
Hemisphere	A half of the earth divided by the equator.
Biome	A large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna occupying a major habitat.
Population	All the inhabitants of a particular place.
Currency	A system of money In general use in a particular country.
Flora	The plants of a particular region, habitat or geological period.
Fauna	The animals of a particular region, habitat or geological period.
