## Meet the teacher meetings

At the beginning of each new school year, we hold a meeting where parents and carers are invited into school to discuss the routines etc. in your child's new class. The meetings are very informal and take place in your child's classroom on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> September. # What do I do if my child is poorly??

Just a reminder, that if your child is poorly, or needs to attend a medical appointment, you need to contact school on each day of their absence...before 9.15am if possible. The latest 'news' from the Government is that medical appointments should be made outside of school hours if they are not an emergency (whenever possible).

Simply dial the school phone number (as above) and press 'option 1' to leave a message. We can then update the attendance registers quickly and accurately and this will save our office staff making the necessary phone calls to find out why a child is not attending school.

You can, if you prefer, e-mail a message to us using the usual address as above, and to office@... Which is Mrs Sudworth's email. (Please 'copy' me using head@... just in case Mrs Feeney or Mrs Sudworth are not in the office.)

Don't forget that statistics have proven that a good attendance at school (preferably above 95%) has a positive impact on progress and achievement. Can we beat our 100% attenders for the whole year which in 2015-2016 was 11.5% of the school – 19 children.

# Friday's Celebration Worship

Starting this Friday, in the school hall, we will be holding our usual 'Celebration Worship'. If your child / children is/are chosen for doing something special, you will receive a personal invitation on the day before. However, as usual, all parents, carers and family members are invited to join us during our Celebration Worship...just help yourself to a chair at the back. It will begin at 2.55pm and finishes just before 3.25pm - our usual picking up time for our younger children.

Please note:

- There <u>will</u> be a Celebration Worship as usual next week (16<sup>th</sup> September), in addition to our Harvest Celebrations in the morning.
- There will not be any children from Mrs Warburton's Reception Class in the Harvest service or on 'the bench' until Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> September, when they will join us in Celebration Worship for the first time.

# Are You Applying for School/Academy Places for September 2017??

Do you have a child who has a 4<sup>th</sup> birthday between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017, or is his/her last year of Primary School from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016?? - then for Lancashire resident families you need to apply for a school place, even if an older brother or sister is already attending your preferred school/academy.

The means of application is via Lancashire's on-line system at:-

www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools (then click on "Apply for a school place")

This already went live on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016. It is quick and easy to use and offers an e-mail receipt of all submitted applications. Please ensure that you hit the "submit" button when you are ready to send in your completed on-line application. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your on-line application.

The closing dates for applications for September 2017 are at 11-59 pm on:-

Secondary school applications - 31st October 2016

Primary school applications - 15th January 2017

## A reminder about our Policy on Medicines in School (p18 of our Prospectus)

As a general rule, therefore, we do not administer medicines in school. The vast majority of paediatric medicines are intended to be taken three times a day (before school, after school, before bedtime). In very exceptional circumstances, the school will co-operate and, in these instances, parents and carers will be required to complete the necessary school forms to be able to administer **prescribed medicines only**.
