### Last Week's Attendance

Last week - 177 pupils (out of 201 children) attended school for 100% of the time - they didn't miss one session of school.

22 children (from 17 different families) were late for school at least one session of school (after 9.00am)...which seems a bit high - but we did have a day of heavy frost and a 'snow day'!!!

The best attending classes for the week was Mrs Seeley's Year 1 class - with the attendance figure of just over 99.1%.
