Meet the Teacher Evening - Wednesday 20th September 2023

On Wednesday 20th September, we are holding a meeting where parents and carers are invited into school to discuss the routines etc. in your child's new class. The meetings are very informal and will take place in your child's classroom.

Please note that the evening is for Parents and Carers only and unfortunately, we do not have any Crèche Facilities for the evening.

On the same Wednesday, Mrs Birkby and members of the Infant team will be running a workshop looking at the teaching of Phonics. This is open to ANY parent or carer. If you would like to attend the session it will be held in the School Hall before the Meet the Teacher sessions. It's free of charge so just turn up if you would like a greater insight into the teaching of Phonics at school.

Covid-19 guidance

Unfortunately this week we have had a number of staff test positive for Covid. Please read below for the current Covid-19 guidance on what to do.

What happens if a staff member or my child tests positive for COVID-19?

For children and young people aged 18 and under who test positive for COVID-19, the advice is to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for three days. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result are advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious.

The UKHSA has also published public health guidance on <u>living safely with respiratory infections, including</u> <u>COVID-19</u>.

Car Park safety

Just a polite request to remind parents not to use the staff car park as a short cut to the playground. There have been a couple of "near-misses" where staff have been pulling onto the car park and children and parents have been cutting across it. Please stick to the path from the playground if accessing the front office and please do not enter/exit at the entrance into the car park.

RAAC

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated.

We wanted to inform you that THT is not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal. We understand that parents / carers may want to understand more about the support to educational settings to manage RAAC safely. You can read more through the article published by the DfE on the Education Hub.

The means of application is via Lancashire's on-line system at:-

This already went live on 1st September 2023. It is quick and easy to use and offers an e-mail receipt of all submitted applications. Please ensure that you hit the "submit" button when you are ready to send in your completed on-line application. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your on-line application.

The closing dates for applications for September 2024 are at 11-59 pm on:-

Secondary school applications - 31st October 2023

Primary school applications - 15th January 2024
