The Reception children will not take part in the competition, but instead will perform a poem altogether.

All parents / carers / family members are welcome to watch the worship - and if your child makes the final, you will receive a special invitation from Mrs Birkby on Thursday.

<u>Easter Lunch and School Dinners</u> - The week beginning the 6th March is 'Week 1' of the Lancashire Lunch Winter Menu. Changes to week 1's menu: Janet is changing the Meatball Sauce from Tomato (with Pasta) to Gravy with Mashed Potatoes. She is also changing Tuesday's Macaroni Cheese to a Cheese Whirl and the Chicken Curry on a Wednesday will be Korma and not Tikka Masala.

Don't forget, as usual, in addition to the advertised meals - the children can choose a jacket potato on the day or there is a choice of 3 sandwiches (ham, cheese or tuna) which can be booked online via ParentPay.

We are pleased to invite you to the Easter Lunch on 5th April which is now live to book on ParentPay for both pupils and parents/carers!! The menu is Roast Beef & Yorkshire Pudding with Creamed Potatoes, Broccoli & Carrots or Sweet Red Pepper & Tomato Pasta with Garlic Bread. Pudding is Easter Cup Cake or Easter Biscuit.

Parents / Carers need to go to the item on ParentPay (Adult Easter Meal) to pay for an adult ticket. Please put 'beef' or 'pasta' in the notes field so that we know what you want to eat on the day. For the Easter Lunch we have limited places to one per family - which was a request from many of you after the Christmas Meal.

Please also go into your child's dinner account, in the usual way, and select their meal preference too for the Easter Lunch.

<u>Sainsbury's Active Kids Vouchers</u> - Don't forget that Sainsbury's have started their Active Kids Campaign for 2017 and are giving out vouchers after you have shopped with them. These are designed to, "help more kids eat well, move well and live well". The vouchers, once collected can be used for schools to redeem in exchange for cooking or active/sports equipment. Please send them into school, and get your children to put them in the box outside Year 6, or simply send them to the school office. The collection phase of Active Kids is from now until 2nd May 2017. I'll remind you know when the campaign is complete so that we can send our 'order off' in time. Thank you in anticipation of your support.

Mr Skinner's Football Practices - As there is a football match coming up this week, Mr Skinner is swapping his Tuesday's Year 3 and 4 practice with his Year 5 and 6 on a Friday. <u>Friends Scarecrow Festival planning Meeting</u> - This Thursday (2nd March) there will be a planning meeting at 8pm in the Village Inn - please come along if you can!!

<u>Year 2 Road Safety</u> - For the next four Wednesdays Year 2 will be having their Road safety training where they look at safety on the pavement and when crossing the road. Please can you ensure that the children have their coats on these days and that the activities covered in school are followed up at home (worksheets will be coming home). Thank you!!

<u>Fairtrade Fortnight</u> - For the next two weeks it is Fairtrade fortnight where we look at how the Fairtrade organisation tries to make sure that workers in Africa and the farmers of coffee and cocoa are paid a decent wage. As we are a Fairtrade school we are supporting the fortnight and on Thursday a competition will be coming home for the children to take part in.

When you are shopping see if you can spot the Fairtrade logo... (Which is part of the YR to Y3 competition)...or even buy some of the Fairtrade items...we drink the tea and Coffee in school (coffee £2.29 and Tea £1.19!!).

Please read the Competition sheets when they arrive, so that the children know what to do...and then make sure that all entries are back into school by 9.30am on Friday 10th March. Good luck!!
