Works at THT

Over the Easter Break we are having some work done at THT - the Hall Floor and some tree work. The Hall Floor is being stripped back to bare wood and then having 3 layers of lacquer applied - so it should be shiny, clean and ready for another 10 years of use, once we come back on the 8th April. Some of the Ash trees on the perimeter of the grounds have 'Ash Dieback' and need to be removed for safety reasons. We will be recycling the trees, using the logs for seats, branches for shelter building and chippings for the floor in our Infant seating area.

We have already ordered some trees from the Woodland Trust - but these won't arrive until later in the year. We are therefore trying our best to replace the trees that we cut down!!

A Sensory Journey Through Easter

Mrs Seeley, our Faith Advocates and Diamond Disciples organised a very special day for the whole school yesterday - and it was thoroughly enjoyed by all!! Thank you to all for your very hard work in putting this together!!

The morning started with an Act of Worship and this looked at the Easter Story starting at Palm Sunday - the children had to put the huge pictures into order.

The children were then split into groups containing children from each class and they spent 30 minutes doing 8 different activities. The majority of the activities focused on our senses and linked them to different events which took place during Holy Week. For instance the children got to taste Hot Cross Buns (Good Friday) and Easter Eggs (Easter Sunday). They smelt palm leaves (Palm Sunday) and wood shavings (Good Friday) and felt things in 'feely bags' all related to the Easter Story.

Other activities included the design of crosses and a 'Pass the Parcel' where the prizes were sweets - and also Bible Quotes which needed to be put into order!
