Our New InVentry Signing in System

If you visit the school (and formally sign in), you volunteer in school or you pick up / drop off your child / children at school outside of the usual times (i.e. they are late or you pick them up early for an appointment etc.) you must use the Inventry System. It is easy and simple to use - but please be patient as people get used to the system.

If you sign in as a visitor, you will be asked to agree to the following message:

At Tarleton Holy Trinity, we are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expect all staff, volunteers and visitors to share this commitment.

This Visitor Pass System is used to enhance the security of the school and its pupils as well as providing an up to date record for the Fire regulations. Please complete all required details requested on the screen.

* Please wear the badge provided for the entirety of your visit and hand it back to the office after signing out.

* Please remember that the use of mobile phones is only permitted in school offices

* Photographs of children and/or adults can only be taken in line with school policy and with the written consent of the parent / carer or relevant adult

* Contractors must not commence work until they have reported to a relevant member of the school staff and necessary permit to work documentation has been completed.

* Visitors are requested not to enter classrooms or teaching areas without permission.

* The use of school computer equipment and/or the connection of any equipment to the school's network is prohibited.

* If the fire alarm sounds, leave the building by the nearest exit; assemble on the rear playground or front car park and make yourself known to a member of staff.

Did you know ...

Next week sees the start of June...

June is the sixth month of the year in the Gregorian calendar and its predecessor, the Julian calendar. It is believed that the month is named after the Roman goddess Juno, who is the wife of Jupiter and is also equivalent to the Greek goddess Hera. Another belief is that the month's name comes from the Latin word '*iuniores*' which means "younger ones". June was originally the fourth month of the year in the Roman calendar and consisted of 30 days. It became the fifth month with a length of 29 days when Numa reformed the Roman calendar. During the Julian reform, June was moved to the sixth month and given a length of 30 days again.
