Faith and Charity in Action

In the last week of term Mrs Birkby will be travelling to Uganda for 10 days with former member of staff Mr Marshall. This is because THT has long-standing links with the charity 'International Needs Uganda' and it is our chosen charity this year. Some of you may remember that Reverend Justus Miwanda, Executive Director of 'International Needs Uganda' visited THT with 'The Pearl of Africa Choir' in 2018. THT After School Club and some individual members of staff have been sponsoring Ugandan children ever since. Mr Marshall and his family made several visits and helped build a school.

Last year a large amount of money was raised in memory of Joseph Marshall which was donated to 'IN Uganda' to fund a village well, and this Christmas THT parents also donated money which was used to provide Ugandan pupils with school lunches. Mrs Birkby and Mr Marshall will be attending the official opening of the well in Kikwanya and serving some of the school lunches. They will also spend time teaching in schools, and visiting farms and water and sanitation projects.

Findings from our Parent Questionnaire Spring 2023

During our 'Face to Face' Spring Parents' evening, 70 questionnaires were completed on the night. The questions / statements are that same that are asked by Ofsted on 'Parent View'.

Question 8 asked for your response to the statement: 'The school has high expectations for my child.' 5 of you disagreed with this statement.

Question 9 asked for your response to the statement: 'My child does well at this school'. 1 person disagreed with this statement with two saying that they didn't know.













The School constantly assesses where the children 'are up to' with regard to their knowledge of the curriculum and their standards of attainment. Gaps are 'plugged' where necessary through the use of intervention programmes or extra sessions delivered by the teachers and teaching assistants (TAs). Our End of Key Stage 2 SATs results show that our children are attaining in line with children in Lancashire with regard to writing - but are attaining higher in Reading and in Mathematics.

Water Bottles and Sun Hats

Did you know...

In 2023, Pentecost falls on 28th May – during our 2 week break. It takes place on the seventh Sunday after Easter, which is exactly 50 days later.

Christians mark Pentecost because it is written in the Holy Bible that on this day, the Apostles (disciples) of Jesus Christ felt the Holy Spirit descend on them. A white dove is often used to symbolise this. Another name you might hear for Pentecost is 'Whit Sunday' – which is (naturally) where 'Whitsun' comes from.

In the UK, there has long been a public bank holiday associated with Whitsun.
