### Findings from our Parent Questionnaire Spring 2024

During our Spring 2024 Parents' evening, 120 questionnaires were completed over the course of the 2















nights. The questions / statements are that same that are asked by Ofsted on 'Parent View'.

Question 12 asked for your response to the statement: 'My child can take part in clubs and activities in school.'

2 of you disagreed with this statement - and 2 said that they 'didn't know'.

At THT we offer a variety of clubs for the children to participate in - most of which are free.

During the Year every class from Year 1 to 6 is invited to take part in a West Lancs Sports Partnership Club and we have our own sports clubs run by Mr Skinner for classes in Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to 6).

Miss Jagger runs a Homework Club for all children to attend each Tuesday lunch and Mrs Lancaster runs a Chess Club for the Juniors.

Of course we have our own school choir run by Mrs Simpson (Key Stage 2) as well as the Choir Church After School Club run by me, Mr Stopford and Fr Mark on a Friday. This is open to all children in the school.

...and Miss Iddon (with the help of Mrs Wass) runs a 3D printer club after school on a Tuesday.

A paid for Club is Jonny Urszuly's Ninja Club which runs each Tuesday evening - this is open to all children, over the course of the year.

# Did you know...

In August there are some big changes to the rules on taking children out of school for a holiday: The changes to be aware of are:

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
