Attendance Data for the Week Before the Half Term Break

Last week, 184 pupils (out of a possible 204) attended school for 100% of the time - they didn't miss one session of school. I think this was largely due to holidays being extended outside of the school holiday period.

10 children (from 2 different families) were late for school at least once (after 9.00am).

The best attending class for the week was, once again, Mrs Warburton's Reception Class - with a 'score' of 99.2%
