## Did you know...

If you 'Google' Uganda it sounds like a lovely country:

"It is a landlocked country in East Africa whose diverse landscape encompasses the snow-capped Rwenzori Mountains and immense Lake Victoria. Its abundant wildlife includes endangered gorillas and chimpanzees as well as rare birds. Remote Bwindi Impenetrable National Park is a famous mountain gorilla sanctuary, while Murchison Falls National Park in the northwest is known for its 43m-tall waterfall and wildlife such as hippos."

However, did you know that, in some areas of Uganda, over 1,000 people die each year due to the fact that they do not have access to clean water and only one in five families have access to a toilet...

These can be built by the families through the assistance of the International Needs Charity at a cost around £250 for each toilet. Hopefully our sponsor money can go towards building some of these!!
