


Key word	Definition
Compass	A tool used to find direction.
East	The direction where the sun rises.
Legend	A key on a map that explains what the symbols mean.
Map	A representation of an area, usually on a flat surface, showing the location of physical features, buildings, and other details.
North	The direction towards the North Pole.
Scale	The relationship between the distance on the map and the distance in real life.
South	The direction towards the South Pole.
Symbol	A picture or shape used to represent something on a map.
West	The direction where the sun sets.
