Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Key word	Definition
Celeste	A musical instrument that produces a twinkling, bell-like sound.
Dynamics	The loudness or softness of music.
Graphic score	A type of musical notation that uses pictures or symbols to represent sounds and other musical elements.
Pitch	How high or low a note is.
Pulse	The steady beat or rhythm of a song that you can tap your foot to.
Rhythm	The pattern of sounds and silences in music.
Structure	The overall organisation of a song or piece of music, including the arrangement of sections like verses and choruses.
Tempo	The speed of the music, whether it is fast or slow.
Texture	The way different sounds and instruments are combined to create a fuller or thinner sound.
Timbre	The unique quality of a sound that distinguishes it from other sounds, like the difference between a piano and a trumpet.
