<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parents and grandparents played with similar toys to children now. The differences are mainly with what the toys were made out of and what the toys can do now that they couldn't back then. Some toys from this time in history are similar to the toys we play with now. They might look different to the modern versions because of different packaging designs. Other toys in history are different because of what they are made out of. A toy ride on car from the 1960s would have been made out of wood, today they are made of plastic. We would call toys from the 1960s 'old' toys. Toys after this time are older than modern day toys but newer than 1960s toys. Modern day toys are similar to toys from the past but some are different. The differences are because of: advances in technology, changes in packaging and design, changes in manufacturing (how the toys are made). Future toys will be different again! 	 <p>The timeline shows the evolution of toys across five eras: Victorian Toys (teddy bear, crayons, motorcycle), Early 20th Century Toys (tea set, alphabet blocks, LEGO), Grandparents' Toys (LEGO, dollhouse), Parents' Toys (doll, TV, robot), and Your Toys (modern toys).</p>
