2015 Parent Questionnaire Findings...

This is the second 'instalment' of what the results told us, and what we need to work on to make THT an even better school than it already is ...

Question 2 asked you to respond to the statement, 'The School keeps my child safe'. 98% of you agreed with this...with 2% stating that they 'Don't know'.

At THT we insist that all staff and volunteers undergo the necessary checks before they work with children and Staff are all trained in first aid, child protection and many are trained in the safety issues when using ladders etc.

Our perimeter is securely locked during the day and there is a rigorous signing in process when visitors come to the school. Any instances of unsafe behaviour is reported to the class teachers and is dealt with quickly and efficiently.
