2015 Parent Questionnaire Findings...

The next response to the questionnaire... Question 6 asked parents and carers to respond to the statement: 'The school makes sure that my child is well prepared for the future.

86% of parents/carers agreed with this statement, with 12% of parents/carers stating that they didn't know and 2% disagreeing.

At Tarleton Holy Trinity we try to make sure that the children are always ready for their next step in life. Before the children start in Reception, we have special taster mornings and of course Stepping Stones that the children can attend to familiarise themselves with life at THT. At the end of each year we always have a 'Move Up Morning' where the children spend the morning with their next teacher to get used to the new classroom and to find out where trays are etc.

With the older children we have annual 'Growing Up' talks with them and then of course in Year 6 there are a wide range of activities that we do at the local High Schools so that the children are ready for their transition to Year 7.

In some of our classes we teach the Right Start programmes which looks at safety near the road, whether as a cyclist or as a pedestrian and throughout their time at Tarleton Holy Trinity we always strive to get the children to do their best, follow the Christian Values and learn the power of resilience and persistence. I know there's a lot more we can do...but it's hard to pack it all into 39 weeks each year!!















<u>Attendance Figures</u> - Last week 136 of our children (out of 161) managed to achieve 100% attendance. During the same week just five children were late for school for at least one session. Well done to Mrs Simpson's and Miss Jagger's Year 5 Class who were the best attending class for the week - for the second week running!!
