My bell ringing club and I will remind you about the service by ringing the bells from 1.15pm onwards!!

Once the service has finished the children will come back to school and will finish the school day at the usual time of 3.25 / 3.30pm.

Attendance Figures

Last week 130 of our children (out of 161) managed to achieve 100% attendance. ...and Mrs Warburton's Class were the best attending class for the week - well done Reception!!

2015 Parent Questionnaire Findings...

The next response to the questionnaire... Question 9 asked parents and carers to respond to the statement: 'This school deals effectively with unacceptable behaviour'. 86% of you agreed with this, and 14% said that you 'Didn't know'.

In answer to a similar question in previous surveys only 81% of you agreed (in 2014) and 65% in 2013...so quite an improvement in one year.

I always think that the first 'job' of a Headteacher is to make sure that all the children are safe and happy in school....indeed Ofsted commented in their 2013 report that 'Pupils behaviour is typically good and often outstanding'.

Before the Autumn Term starts each year all the staff work together to update the school's behaviour policy to ensure that good work and good behaviour are being recognised, and that there are clear consequences if any inappropriate or bad behaviour occurs. The children are very aware of the policy and all staff and children support and follow the 5 'Golden Rules' which we have in place. I feel that our Behaviour Policy is robust and any incident, should they occur, would be dealt with quickly and efficiently with full communication made at each point to the pupils and to the parents/carers.

Since I have been Headteacher at Tarleton Holy Trinity there have been no reported cases of bullying in school.

School Dinners

The week beginning the 28th March is 'Week 3' Slight alterations to week 3's menu: Janet is swapping Wednesday's Chicken Tikka Masala to a Chicken Korma and replacing Friday's Calzone Pizza with a Pizza Margherita. As usual, in addition to the advertised meals - the children can choose from 3 sandwiches (ham, cheese or tuna) or can request a jacket potato, but please can they book this during registration in the morning.


Breakfast and After School Club

Did you know...?

This Sunday at 1.00am the clocks jump forward 1 hour for the beginning of British Summer Time. According to some websites, the first British advocate of daylight savings time was William Willett, who published a pamphlet in 1907 entitled A Waste of Daylight that advised his fellow countrymen to make the most of summer by getting up earlier. He was a keen golfer and it was partly his frustration at having his games cut short by nightfall that turned him into a passionate campaigner for an extra hour of sunlight. However, Britain didn't adopt the idea until 1916, a few weeks after Germany and Austria-Hungary implemented it as a wartime measure.
