Did you know...?

We hope you had a lovely Easter weekend and you received some Easter Eggs!!

The earliest Easter eggs on record were hen or duck eggs decorated at home in bright colours with vegetable dye and charcoal. The 17th and 18th centuries then saw the manufacture of egg-shaped toys, which were given to children at Easter.

Chocolate Easter eggs were first made in Europe in the early 19th century, with France and Germany taking the lead in this new artistic confectionery. Some early eggs were solid, as the technique for mass-producing moulded chocolate had not been devised.

John Cadbury (of Cadbury's) made his first 'French eating Chocolate' in 1842 but it was not until 1875 that the first Cadbury Easter Eggs were made.
