A Reminder about Haircuts

It is requested that long hair (shoulder length or longer) should always be tied up, not only for Health and Safety reasons but also to discourage head lice. We request that parents do not allow children to have their hair coloured, shaved too short, cut in lines or patterns, or gelled into extreme styles in school term time. Did you know ...?

This week it is SATs week for Year 6...here's the history:

Standard assessment tests (SATs) were introduced in phases, starting in 1991. By 1998, there were tests for seven, 11 and 14-year-olds. Some schools actually 'boycotted' the SATs in 1993 and this was spearheaded by the two main classroom teacher unions, the NUT and NASUWT.

SATs were phased out in Wales between 2002 and 2005.

The first signs of change in England came in 2004, when Staffordshire schools took part in a pilot for a new way of assessing seven-year-olds. Instead of everything resting on how an infant performed on a test day, SATs were just used to inform their teacher's overall judgements of their abilities. Parents were given a "teacher assessment" level rather than the test result.

In late 2008, the Government scrapped SATs for 14-year-olds. This left SATs for 11-year-olds in England as the only remaining statutory tests, although they no longer include science.
